



Forest Resource Monitor

The Forest Resource Monitor is responsible for coordinating with SCMF and USFS resource staff to identify monitoring needs for protection of Threatened and Endangered Species on the SBNF; including checking, repairing and reporting on protected sites outlined in project maps, directing and oversight of work crews, making public contacts in the field and providing public education about protected areas, monitor the forest for unauthorized use and breaches in protected areas, and coordinating with resource staff to mitigate damage to protected sites. In addition to field work, the forest resource monitor is responsible for tracking deliverables and reporting on work completed during the term. Daily work reports are also required.

Job Duties:

- Perform resource patrols to identify needs for fence construction or repair, or other resource protection measures
- Install and repair broken fences and signs
- Assist SBNF across the forest with field restoration projects by engaging volunteers and mobilizing SCMF staff & corps members to assist as needed
- Supervise, transport and train volunteers and crew members to assist with projects
- Maintain records for resource monitoring – ex. site monitoring forms, volunteer sign-in sheets
- Assist, help and cooperate with other SCMF staff to meet the goals of the SCMF
- Work alongside USFS staff to complete joint deliverables
- Other duties as assigned
